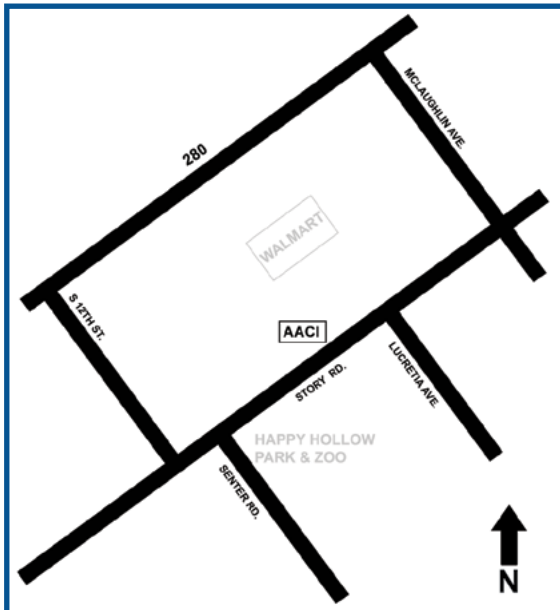

Services Provided at the Family Justice Center:

- Advocacy and counseling services for survivors of domestic violence and their children.
- Legal services including immigration and domestic violence-related family court services, such as restraining orders, spousal support, and child custody.
- Personal contact with Police investigators who specialize in Domestic Violence and Stalking.
- Personal contact with attorneys from the District Attorneys Office.
- Personal contact with Probation Officers.
- Referral to 24-hour emergency shelters.
- Personal contact with Victim Services Unit of the District Attorney's Office.
- Physical & mental health services.
