Domestic Violence

Domestic violence is a pattern of abusive or violent behavior that one partner uses to exert power and control over the other in a marriage, partnership, or intimate relationship.

Violence appears in the form of sexual assault, threats, coercion, physical abuse, verbal abuse, emotional mistreatment, and/or destruction of property.

If you are experiencing domestic violence, you are not alone.

- Domestic violence is the leading cause of injury to women ages 15 to 44 in the United States.
- Domestic violence occurs among people of all cultures, races, religions, ages, sexual orientations, education and income levels.
- Domestic violence in the LGBTQ population occurs in the same frequency and degree as in the heterosexual population.
- It happens to newcomers to the U.S. and to those who were born here.
- It happens to married, partnered, dating, and single people; women and men.

Domestic violence is against the law. You have the right, by law, to live free from abuse and fear of violence.

Our Program

AACI Asian Women's Home was created in 1986 to address the unmet needs of underserved survivors, particularly within the Asian community.

Our mission is to create a support network for survivors by providing services that prioritize their linguistic and cultural needs and by cooperating with other service providers to bridge service gaps

While we focus on the Asian community, we serve individuals from all backgrounds regardless of their ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, socioeconomic level, or immigration status. All are welcomed.
